

72-core optical fiber cable color chart

Article Overview

A 72-core optical fiber cable typically uses multiple color-coded buffer tubes, each containing 12 fibers in the standard 12-color sequence, with the outer jacket color indicating the fiber type.

Outer Jacket Color

The outer jacket of the cable indicates the fiber type:

- o Yellow for single-mode fibers (OS1/OS2)
- o Aqua for OM3/OM4 multimode fibers
- o Erika Violet may be used for OM4 in some high-density data centers
- o Lime Green for OM5 multimode fibers supporting SWDM applications .

Buffer Tube and Fiber Colors

A 72-core cable is typically divided into 6 buffer tubes, each containing 12 fibers. Each tube follows the TIA-598-C 12-color sequence for individual fibers:

- o Blue
- o Orange
- o Green
- o Brown
- o Slate (Gray)
- o White
- o Red
- o Black
- o Yellow
- o Violet
- o Rose (Pink)
- o Aqua The buffer tubes themselves are also color-coded to distinguish each 12-fiber group. For example, the first tube might be Blue, the second Orange, the third Green, and so on .

Identifying Individual Fibers

To identify a specific fiber in a 72-core cable:

- o Determine the tube number (based on the fiber's position in the 12-fiber groups).
- o Identify the fiber color within that tube using the 12-color sequence. For instance, fiber #34 would be in the 3rd buffer tube (Green tube) and be the 10th fiber within that tube (Violet fiber), .

- o Buffer tube colors: distinguish each 12-fiber group
- o Individual fiber colors: follow the 12-color TIA-598-C sequence within each tube This hierarchical color system ensures easy identification, safe installation, and error-free splicing in high-density fiber optic networks .
