- o **Check Clearance:** Ensure that crossbars do not interfere with tray covers. Many trough trays have tool-less or bolted covers that snap over the crossbars, maintaining protection and accessibility .

- o **Avoid Overloading:** Calculate the total cable weight and ensure the tray and crossbars can support it without excessive deflection.
- o **Maintain Ventilation:** Trough trays are ventilated to prevent heat buildup. Crossbars should not block airflow around cables.
- o **Follow Manufacturer Instructions:** Always adhere to the tray manufacturer's specifications for crossbar installation, spacing, and load limits to comply with safety standards .
