



Aluminum cable connection to distribution box circuit breaker

CO/ALR (copper/aluminum) circuit breakers are specifically manufactured to accommodate both aluminum and copper wiring. These breakers employ a unique design that includes bypass mechanisms and anti-corrosion coatings to prevent loose connections and reduce the likelihood of connection of the cables/bars to the circuit-breaker terminals.
