When grinding electrical distribution boxes, the maximum angular exposure of the grinding wheel should not exceed 90° for general work, or 125° when contacting work below the horizontal plane, starting no more than 65° above the horizontal plane of the spindle.

OSHA and Safety Guidelines

According to OSHA standards for abrasive wheels, floor, bench, and portable grinders must have safety guards that limit wheel exposure. The maximum angular exposure of the wheel periphery and sides is 90° for standard grinding operations. If the work requires contact below the horizontal plane of the spindle, the exposure can increase to 125°, but the exposure must begin no more than 65° above the horizontal plane of the spindle to protect the operator from debris and kickback (OSHA 1926.303).

Angle Grinder Operation Best Practices

- o Use the correct disc for the material of the distribution box (metal or coated steel) and ensure it is rated for the grinder's speed.
- o Position the guard between the operator and the disc, covering at least half of the disc to reduce risk of injury.
- o Hold the grinder with two hands, one on the handle and one supporting the tool, applying minimal pressure to avoid the disc digging in.
- o Maintain proper angles: the grinder should be held so that the disc contacts the workpiece at a safe, controlled angle, typically 15°-30° for surface grinding, while ensuring the guard limits exposure as per OSHA requirements.
- o Avoid grinding with cutting wheels and never use worn or damaged discs.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)

Operators must wear safety glasses with face shield, gloves, hearing protection, safety footwear, and flame-resistant clothing. Ensure the work area is clear of flammable materials and maintain a fire watch for at least 30 minutes after grinding.
