Planning and Layout

Cable Arrangement

- o Maintain proper spacing between cables to avoid overheating; follow manufacturer guidelines for cable fill and spacing .
- o Use cable ties or straps to secure lighting cables neatly along the tray, leaving enough slack for thermal expansion or future adjustments .
- o Respect bend radii when routing cables around corners or bends to prevent damage .

- o Ground and bond metal trays properly to maintain electrical safety and compliance with standards .
