

Assembly Steps for the Electrical Box

For old work boxes, trace the box outline on the wall and cut the opening with a jab saw. For new work, position the box on the stud at the desired height and mark screw locations .

6. Mount the Box

- o New Work: Secure the box to the stud using screws or nails. Ensure it is level and flush with the future wall surface.
- o Old Work: Insert the box into the wall opening and tighten the internal clamps or wings to hold it firmly in



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place .

7. Prepare and Insert Wires

Strip insulation from the ends of wires and insert them into the box through the provided knockouts. Use wire connectors to join wires as needed, keeping connections neat and organized .

8. Connect Devices

Attach switches, outlets, or other devices to the wires according to manufacturer instructions. Ensure ground wires are properly connected to the box if it is metal .

9. Final Checks

- o Verify all connections are secure.
- o Ensure no bare wires are exposed.
- o Confirm the box is firmly mounted and level.
- o Restore power and test the circuit for proper operation .
