

Brazil installs fiber optic cables

Brazil is rapidly expanding its fiber optic infrastructure through submarine and terrestrial networks, aiming to improve connectivity across the Amazon, coastal regions, and urban areas.

Submarine Fiber Optic Projects

Brazil is investing heavily in submarine fiber optic cables to connect remote regions and enhance international connectivity. The Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) and the Agence Francaise de Developpement (AFD) are co-financing projects totaling \$324 million to install submarine cables in Maranhao and Para, benefiting around 15 million people. This initiative will provide internet access to 350,000 students, 250 quilombola communities, 110 Indigenous villages, and 100 riverside communities, while a new regional data center will improve digital public services for 2 million people. The project also strengthens Brazil's digital links with French Guiana and Europe . Additionally, Global Fiber is building a subsea "festoon" network connecting Belem and Fortaleza, part of a larger Amazon region network linking Lima, Leticia, and Tabatinga. This network aims to reduce digital gaps in hard-to-reach areas and improve connectivity across the Amazon . Fortaleza is emerging as a key subsea landing point, hosting at least 10 operational or planned cables, including EllaLink, the only direct link between South America and Europe .

Terrestrial Fiber and Market Expansion

On the terrestrial side, Brazil's fiber availability is around 82%, supporting an average fixed download speed of 180 Mbps, surpassing countries like South Korea and the UK . Government programs such as Norte Conectado have delivered sub-Amazon fiber trunk cables connecting northern Brazil and Colombia, improving rural connectivity . The Brazilian fiber optic market has seen rapid growth, with investments in FTTH (Fiber to the Home) and FTTR (Fiber to the Room) technologies. Innovations like Rollable Ribbon fiber allow higher density and flexible installation in urban and corporate environments, while solutions like InvisiLight enable discreet indoor fiber deployment .

Local Production and Technological Development

Brazil has also expanded domestic production. YOFC Brasil inaugurated a communication optical cable production base in Minas Gerais, enhancing local manufacturing capabilities and supporting technological cooperation between Brazil and China . This facility contributes to more reliable and stable communication infrastructure, supporting the country's digital economy.
