- o Connector types: Clearly mark connectors to avoid misconnection.
- o Unique identifiers: Assign each cable a distinct ID to prevent duplication .

Labeling Materials and Methods

Durable and environment-appropriate labels are essential:

- o Indoor labels: Thermal transfer labels are ideal for racks and controlled environments .
- o Outdoor or industrial labels: Heat-shrink tubing labels resist UV exposure, scratching, and harsh conditions .
- o Wrap-around flags: Flexible for cables that may change paths, though they require secure placement to prevent loosening .
- o Self-laminating tags: Provide writable, protective surfaces for easy updates .

Placement Guidelines

- o Place labels 3-6 inches from each endpoint and at midpoints for long runs.
- o Orient text to be readable from the equipment rack or access point.
- o Conduct quarterly audits to check label integrity and replace deteriorated labels .
