1. Plan Your Labeling System Before attaching tags, create a clear labeling scheme. Assign each cable a unique ID or code that is easy to understand and consistent across the system. Abbreviate where possible (e.g., "C" for cable) to keep labels concise . 2. Select the Right Tag Type

- o Plastic tag holders: Cut to length and attach with cable ties; labels slide into channels and are secured with a nylon button .

- o Marker ties: Specialized cable ties with a built-in tag area; can be nylon, stainless steel, or colored for easy identification .

- o Gently pull the tag to ensure it is secure .

- o Inspect labels periodically for peeling, fading, or damage, and replace as needed .

- o Keep spare labels and tag holders for quick updates during maintenance or system changes . 7. Optional Digital Record-Keeping

- o Maintain a spreadsheet or database mapping each cable ID to its destination and function. This complements physical tags and simplifies troubleshooting . By following these steps, you can efficiently label and hang cable tags on distribution boxes, improving organization, safety, and ease of maintenance while allowing for future updates or changes.
