Cable tray branches are installed using tees or wyes to extend the main tray while maintaining proper support, clearance, and NEC compliance.

Planning the Branch

Before installing a branch, plan the route carefully. Identify where the branch will diverge from the main tray and ensure it avoids obstructions like HVAC ducts, pipes, or structural elements. Mark the path using a chalk line or laser level to maintain alignment and proper slope for drainage if required. Consider future expansion and cable fill to avoid overcrowding the tray system .

Selecting the Right Components

- o Branch Fittings: Use tee or wye fittings compatible with your tray type (ladder, ventilated trough, or solid-bottom). These fittings allow a smooth transition from the main tray to the branch.
- o Connectors and Splice Plates: Secure the branch to the main tray using splice plates or couplers to maintain structural integrity and alignment .
- o Tray Material: Match the branch tray material to the main tray (aluminum, steel, or FRP) to ensure consistent load-bearing and corrosion resistance .

Support and Mounting

- o Support Spacing: Install supports for the branch at intervals similar to the main tray, typically 1.5 to 3 meters depending on tray type and load .
- o Anchoring: Use wall brackets, ceiling struts, or threaded rods to secure the branch. Ensure the branch is level and properly aligned with the main tray.
- o Expansion Considerations: For long branches, include expansion splice plates to accommodate thermal expansion and contraction .

Cable Management and NEC Compliance

- o Cable Fill: Do not exceed 40% fill for power cables and 50% for control cables in the branch tray .
- o Separation: Maintain separation between high-power and low-power cables to prevent electromagnetic interference (EMI), .
- o Clearances: Ensure at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above the branch for maintenance access .
- o Grounding: Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors if properly bonded .

- o Use cable ties or clamps to secure cables within the branch tray without compressing them.
