Safety and Isolation Considerations

When cable trays are installed near iron pipes, maintaining adequate safety distances is critical. Pipes carrying liquids, gases, or corrosive substances can pose risks to electrical cables through heat radiation, vibration, or chemical leakage, which may lead to insulation damage, short circuits, or fire hazards. To mitigate these risks, isolation materials such as G-10 sheets, FRP, or other non-conductive barriers are placed between the cable tray and the iron pipe or metal support. This prevents direct contact, reduces vibration transfer, and protects cables from potential chemical exposure.

Installation Best Practices

- o Spacing: Ensure sufficient clearance between cable trays and iron pipes according to the type of cables, pipe contents, and operating conditions.
- o Support Fabrication: Use MS angles or channels welded or bolted to the iron pipe framework to create a secure mounting for the tray.
- o Fastening: Employ high-strength bolts (e.g., M8) and coupler plates for tray joints to maintain stability.
- o Corrosion Protection: Apply primer and enamel coatings on welded areas or exposed metal surfaces to prevent rust and degradation.
- o Maintenance Access: Maintain enough space for inspection and repair to avoid operational downtime and ensure safety.
