- o Bolt Through Tray and Plate: Pass the truss-head bolts through the tray and joint plate, securing with combination nuts on the opposite side.
- o Torque Properly: Use a spanner or torque wrench to tighten bolts to the manufacturer's recommended torque to prevent loosening under load.
- o Optional Joint Plate for Wider Trays: For tray widths of 400 mm or more, a joint plate is required to prevent transverse bending; for widths up to 300 mm, it may be optional.
