

Can I use a cold connection without a pigtail

A: Yes, cold connections can be used with non-metal materials, such as leather or wood. The method used to connect this neutral conductor--the pigtail versus the plug-on neutral--represents an evolution in panel design, impacting installation practices and panel organization. However, the specific technique and materials used will depend on the type of material being used. Connecting two standard-size wires is pretty. Pigtail is the "better" method if time is not a factor, you can make a good splice, and you have some spare wire of the appropriate gauge to make pigtails with. If you splice through the outlet screws and one outlet goes down, every other outlet down the chain will go down and you'll have to. I have always thought that the best way to wire a receptacle is to use a pigtail lead from the supply wires to the receptacle. When receptacles are. Normally the termination is done without a pigtail: connect the two blacks / hots to the receptacle's two hot terminal screws, and the two whites to the receptacle's two neutral screws. (The tab is removable for certain wiring.
