

Can a network card be connected to a fiber optic router

- o Connect your PC - plug your NIC into the router via Ethernet or, if using a fiber NIC, insert the appropriate transceiver and connect the fiber cable directly to the router's SFP port ().
- o Optimize NIC settings - update drivers, set speed to 1 Gbps Full Duplex, disable QoS and interrupt moderation for maximum performance ().

- o Ensure all cables are secure and undamaged, as fiber is fragile ().
