Protect the Box and Internal Components

Even when empty, the fiber termination box (FTB) should be kept closed and locked if possible to prevent dust, moisture, or physical damage to the internal components . Outdoor boxes should maintain their IP-rated protection (e.g., IP65 or IP68) to ensure they remain dust-proof and watertight . For indoor boxes, ensure the housing is intact and free from cracks or damage.

Maintain Cable Entry Points

Keep the cable entry slots or glands sealed with plugs or caps to prevent debris from entering the box . This also preserves the integrity of the box for future fiber installation and prevents accidental bending or pinching of fibers when they are eventually installed.

Organize Internal Space

Even without fibers, it is helpful to arrange internal trays, adapters, and protective elements in their designated positions . This ensures that when fibers are added later, they can be routed without obstruction, maintaining proper bend radius and avoiding tangling.

Label and Document

Label the empty box clearly with its location, intended use, and capacity. Keeping a record of empty boxes in your network documentation helps technicians quickly identify available termination points for future expansion .

Optional Protective Measures

- o Use desiccant packs in outdoor boxes to control humidity.
- o Apply cable ties or protective sleeves to secure any pre-installed internal components.
- o Inspect periodically to ensure the box remains clean and undamaged . By following these steps, an empty fiber optic terminal box remains ready for future deployment, protected from environmental hazards, and organized for efficient fiber management when needed.
