

Can't a secondary router be used with a telecom provider

Technical Complexity: Most consumer-grade routers aren't designed to handle multiple internet connections out of the box. You'll need a router capable of "dual WAN" functionality, or you'll need to configure two separate routers. It connects to your Internet Service Provider (ISP) via a modem and then distributes this. While enabling Dual WAN, you can select two ISP connections to your router, a primary WAN and a secondary WAN. There are two modes you can choose to enable when using Dual WAN.
