

Can't fiber optic cables be directly plugged into a router

In these cases, the fiber signal can be received directly by the router, bypassing a separate ONT. However, these routers are less common in residential setups, and you must ensure compatibility with your ISP's fiber protocol (e.g., GPON or XGPON).

Practical Setup Steps

- o Fiber enters your home and terminates at the ONT.
- o Connect the fiber cable to the ONT's optical port, taking care not to damage the delicate connector.
- o Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN port to your router's WAN port.
- o Power on the ONT and router, then configure your network settings as needed.

- o Standard routers cannot interpret optical signals, so a direct fiber connection is not feasible.
