They are often used for both live and neutral connections in larger panels . 5. **Combined or Specialized Terminals** Modern consumer units may include RCBO or RCD terminals, which combine overcurrent and earth fault protection. These terminals allow both live and neutral wires to connect to a single protective device, simplifying wiring and enhancing safety .
