Reducers

Reducers are specialized fittings designed to transition from a wider tray to a narrower one. They maintain the alignment of side rails and provide a smooth path for cables, preventing sharp bends or stress points. Reducers are available for ladder, solid-bottom, and ventilated trays, and they are sized to match the nominal widths of the trays being connected .

Splice Plates

Splice plates are metal plates used to join two tray sections securely. When connecting trays of different widths, splice plates can be combined with reducers or custom brackets to ensure a rigid connection. They are bolted to the side rails and sometimes to the bottom of the tray to maintain load-bearing capacity and prevent misalignment .

Custom Fittings and Adapters

In some installations, especially where standard reducers are not available, custom adapters or fabricated transition pieces can be used. These are designed to match the specific widths and tray types, ensuring proper support for cables and compliance with load ratings. Custom fittings are particularly useful in industrial or data center environments where cable density and routing complexity are high .

Installation Considerations

- o Alignment: Ensure side rails are properly aligned to avoid cable snagging or uneven load distribution.
- o Load Capacity: Wider trays generally support heavier loads; when transitioning to a narrower tray, verify that the narrower section can handle the expected cable weight .
- o Cable Protection: Maintain minimum bend radii for cables as they pass through the transition to prevent damage .
- o Support Spacing: Adjust support hangers or brackets near the transition to maintain structural stability .

Best Practices

- o Use reducers for standard width differences whenever possible.
