North American Residential Boxes

In the United States, standard single-gang boxes for switches or outlets are typically 2" x 3" x 3.5", while junction boxes often measure 4" x 4" with varying depths to accommodate multiple wires . Multi-gang boxes increase in width according to the number of devices installed, and deeper boxes are recommended for GFCIs, dimmers, or smart switches to ensure sufficient wire fill and safe installation . Internal volume, measured in cubic inches, is critical for compliance with NEC and UL standards, as it determines the safe number of conductors and devices that can be installed .
