Electrical distribution boxes and cabinets come in a range of standard sizes, with wall-mounted enclosures typically from 200x200x120 mm to 800x600x300 mm, and freestanding cabinets from 1600-2200 mm in height, 600-1800 mm in width, and 300-600 mm in depth.

Wall-Mounted Enclosures

Wall-mounted electrical boxes are commonly used for residential and light commercial applications. Typical dimensions include:

- o Small enclosures: 200 x 200 x 120 mm, suitable for single devices or small control units .
- o Medium enclosures: 300 x 400 x 150 mm up to 600 x 400 x 200 mm, often used for multiple devices, small machinery, or home automation systems .
- o Large wall-mounted enclosures: Up to 800 x 600 x 300 mm, providing space for more complex wiring, multiple circuit breakers, or future expansion . Depth is particularly important for accommodating wire count and ensuring compliance with NEC wire-fill guidelines, with typical depths ranging from 1.5" to 3.5" for smaller boxes .

Freestanding Cabinets

Freestanding or floor-standing distribution cabinets are used in industrial or commercial settings where larger equipment and higher current distribution are required. Common dimensions include:

- o Height: 1600-2200 mm
- o Width: 600-1800 mm
- o Depth: 300-600 mm These cabinets allow for internal layout flexibility, cable entry space, proper bend radius, heat dissipation, and future spare capacity. Manufacturers often provide size families, so height, width, or depth can be scaled without changing the product series .

Junction and Multi-Gang Boxes

For smaller electrical boxes used in outlets, switches, or junctions:

- o Single-gang boxes: Approximately 2" x 3" x 3.5", suitable for one switch or outlet .
- o Double-gang or multi-gang boxes: 4" x 4" or larger, with multiple depth options to accommodate several devices . Internal volume is critical to prevent overcrowding, allow safe splicing, and ensure compliance with local electrical codes .
