Distribution Box

A distribution box, also called a distribution board or electrical panel, is an enclosure that receives electrical power from the main supply and distributes it to multiple branch circuits in a building . Its primary functions include:

- o Organizing and controlling circuits: It divides electricity into separate circuits for lighting, outlets, and appliances.
- o Safety protection: Equipped with circuit breakers or fuses, it prevents damage from overloads, short circuits, or ground faults .
- o Monitoring and maintenance: Modern distribution boxes may include energy monitoring units and indication lights to identify circuit issues quickly . Circuit Breaker Box

A circuit breaker box is a type of distribution box specifically designed to house circuit breakers, which are automatic switches that interrupt power when excessive current flows . Its main purposes are:

- o Protecting individual circuits: Each breaker trips during overloads or short circuits, preventing fires and equipment damage.
- o Centralized control: The main breaker can shut off power to the entire building for maintenance or emergencies .
- o Ease of resetting: Unlike fuses, circuit breakers can be reset after tripping, restoring power without replacement . Circuit breaker boxes are commonly used in residential homes, commercial buildings, and industrial facilities, and they may serve as main panels, sub-panels, or auxiliary panels depending on the electrical system layout .
