- o Residual Current Devices (RCDs) or Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs): Detect leakage currents and prevent electric shocks, especially in wet areas like kitchens and bathrooms .
- o Fuses: Provide additional overcurrent protection in some setups .
- o Switches/Isolators: Allow circuits to be turned off for maintenance .
- o Surge Protective Devices (SPDs): Protect equipment from voltage spikes .
- o Earthing connections: Ensure proper grounding for safety and system stability . Modern DB boxes may also include smart breakers and monitoring units, enabling remote control, energy management, and real-time load monitoring .

Safety and Installation Tips

- o Breaker selection: Choose a breaker rated slightly above the expected load, following the 80% rule for continuous loads to prevent overheating .
- o Placement: Larger breakers or two-pole breakers are typically installed near the top of the panel for easier wiring and phasing .
- o Space: Leave extra space in the box for future circuit additions or upgrades .
- o Organization: Clearly label circuits and maintain separation to improve safety and maintenance efficiency .
