

Does switching to fiber optic cable require changing the router

- o Test the Connection: Verify that your router is receiving the full speed of your fiber plan and that Wi-Fi coverage is optimal .

Router Compatibility Considerations

- o Ensure your router has a Gigabit Ethernet WAN port to handle high-speed fiber connections .
- o Older routers (Wi-Fi 4 or Wi-Fi 5) may limit fiber speeds; Wi-Fi 6 or 6E routers are recommended for full performance .
- o Some routers are labeled "fiber-ready" or GPON compatible, which ensures they can handle fiber internet efficiently .
