



# Electrical cables enter and exit the distribution box at the same time

## Preview

In angle pulls, conduits enter and exit from adjacent sides of the pull box. Formula: Box Width/Height = 6 x D Where D = Diameter of the largest conduit U-pulls involve conduits. When installing insulated conductors of 4 AWG or larger, the minimum dimensions of pull or junction boxes installed in a raceway or cable run must comply with 314.
