- o Buffering: Lead wires may have semi-tight or tight buffer coatings to protect the fiber during splicing and handling .
- o Pre-terminated Pigtails: Many junction boxes come with pre-installed pigtails, reducing installation time and minimizing handling errors .
- o Splice Trays: Lead wires are typically routed into splice trays inside the box, where fusion or mechanical splicing is performed to join them with incoming fibers .

Installation Considerations

- o Cable Glands: Junction boxes use cable glands to seal incoming cables and maintain environmental protection, often rated IP65 or higher for outdoor use .
- o Bend Radius Management: Proper routing of lead wires ensures the minimum bend radius is maintained, preventing signal loss or fiber damage .
- o Capacity: Boxes vary in capacity, accommodating 2 to 48 fibers or more, depending on the number of pigtails and splice trays .
- o Mounting Options: Fiber optic junction boxes can be wall-mounted, pole-mounted, or rack-mounted, with lead wires organized accordingly .
