Router Compatibility with Fiber

If your current router has a standard WAN Ethernet port and can handle the speeds provided by your fiber plan, you can usually continue using it. The setup involves:

- o Confirming ONT installation by your ISP.
- o Connecting your router to the ONT via Ethernet.
- o Configuring router settings such as VLAN, DHCP, or PPPoE if required by your ISP.
- o Testing your connection to ensure optimal performance . Some ISPs may provide a "conversion kit" or short Ethernet cable to connect your existing router without replacing it .

When to Upgrade Your Router

Upgrading is recommended if your current router is outdated or cannot support the full speed of your fiber plan. Look for routers with:

- o Wi-Fi 6 or Wi-Fi 7 support for better speed and device management.
- o Multiple Gigabit or 10G Ethernet ports for wired connections.
- o Advanced features like LAN aggregation, QoS, and strong security protocols . Using your own router allows for more customization and potentially higher performance, but you are responsible for network security and troubleshooting any connectivity issues .
