Mechanical splicing is often used for temporary or emergency repairs . **Pre-Terminated Fiber:** Using pre-terminated cables can reduce labor costs and installation time, especially for drop locations or short runs, though careful planning is required to match cable lengths .

Termination Costs

Fiber termination involves connecting fibers to devices or patch panels. Costs vary by method:

- o Epoxy and Polish: Traditional method, labor-intensive, high skill required, typically \$20-\$50 per connector .
- o Mechanical Termination: Faster, less labor-intensive, \$10-\$30 per connector .
- o Fusion Splice Termination: Often used for outdoor or underground installations, included in fusion splice cost, generally \$50-\$150 per termination .

- o Termination Method: Fusion splicing is more expensive but offers better performance; mechanical splicing is cheaper but may have higher loss.
