- o Inspect Fiber Optic Cable: Look for visible damage and ensure the cable is properly connected to the router's WAN/ONT port .
- o Restart the Router: Turn off the router, wait 30 seconds, and turn it back on to clear temporary glitches .
- o Verify Cable Connections: Disconnect and reconnect all cables, ensuring they are firmly seated. Replace any damaged cables .
- o Check Power Supply: Plug the router directly into a wall outlet to rule out surge protector issues and ensure stable power .
- o Contact Your ISP: If the red light persists after these steps, your ISP may need to check the line or replace faulty equipment . Following these steps usually resolves the red light issue. If the problem continues, it may indicate a more serious hardware failure requiring professional support.
