

Article Overview

Ghana is developing its fiber optic industry with local manufacturing capabilities and integrating fiber deployment into national infrastructure projects.

Ghana has several companies actively involved in the manufacture and deployment of fiber optic cables, including Spectrum Fibre Limited, which specializes in fiber optic infrastructure, and African Diamond Cable Company Limited (Signal Cable), which manufactures high-quality cables and wires for West Africa . Other notable players include Telesuprecon, Vobiss Solution Ltd, and Datavoice & Power Solutions, which provide installation, maintenance, and network services, supporting both national and regional connectivity .

Government Initiatives

The Ghanaian government has approved the "Dig Once Policy", mandating that all new road construction projects include fiber-optic ducts and access chambers . This policy aims to:

- o Reduce fiber cuts caused by road and construction activities, which account for about 60% of service interruptions .
- o Lower deployment costs and accelerate network rollout, including 5G and broadband expansion .
- o Promote sustainable infrastructure by embedding fiber in reinforced conduits alongside roads . This initiative aligns with Ghana's Digital Economy Policy (2024) and National Broadband Strategy, positioning the country as a leader in infrastructure-led digitalization in Africa .

Economic and Development Impact

Past projects, such as the 1,000 km fiber cable co-financed by Denmark, have demonstrated the economic benefits of fiber infrastructure in Ghana, connecting ministries, departments, and district councils to digital services . Local manufacturing of fiber optic cables supports these initiatives by reducing reliance on imports, enhancing supply chain resilience, and fostering regional expertise in telecommunications technology .

Outlook

With local manufacturers expanding production and government policies facilitating deployment, Ghana is strengthening its digital infrastructure and creating opportunities for investment in fiber optic technology. This development is expected to improve internet access, reduce network downtime, and support the country's broader digital transformation goals .
