- o **Height and Ventilation:** Install the panel at approximately 1.5 meters (5 feet) from the floor, with adequate ventilation to prevent overheating .
- o **Wiring and Protection:** Use proper wire gauge, secure grounding, and include breakers, fuses, and surge protection for each circuit .
- o **Labeling and Maintenance:** Clearly label all circuits and schedule regular inspections to maintain long-term reliability .

For safety and convenience, consider relocating the panel to a garage, basement, or utility room, which typically provides easier compliance with NEC clearance and accessibility requirements . This also reduces noise and potential disruption in a sleeping area.
