

How are cable management racks installed

- o D-Rings Type: Mount similarly to horizontal managers along the rack side.
- o Bend Radius Finger or Finger Duct: Attach to the side of the rack, ensuring fingers or ducts guide cables without sharp bends, preserving cable integrity .

Step 5: Route and Secure Cables

- o Group cables logically by type (LAN, power, patch) and destination.
- o Use Velcro straps or cable ties to bundle cables, avoiding tight bends.
- o Maintain airflow by keeping cables away from ventilation paths.
- o Label cables for easy identification during maintenance or troubleshooting .

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Step 6: Test and Adjust

After installation, verify that all cables are properly routed, devices are accessible, and there is no strain on connectors. Adjust cable paths as needed to maintain a clean, scalable setup .
