

How long should a 24-core optical cable be stripped

Article Overview

For a 24-core optical fiber cable, the recommended fiber bundle strip length is between 42 and 44 inches.

Recommended Stripping Procedure

For 24-core cables, the outer foam jacket should first be stripped about 3 to 4 inches using a wire stripper or similar tool, taking care not to damage the fibers inside . After this initial cut, the remaining foam or jacket can be carefully pulled back to reach the marked strip length on the outer jacket. The total fiber bundle strip length--the length of exposed fibers ready for termination or splicing--should be 42 to 44 inches .

Best Practices

- o Progressive stripping: Multi-layer cables, like 24-core bundles, should be stripped layer by layer. Each layer (outer jacket, aramid yarn, buffer tubes) may require different lengths depending on the connector or splicing hardware .
- o Use proper tools: Fiber strippers, either manual or automated, are designed to remove jackets and buffers without nicking the glass fibers .
- o Clean cuts: Ensure the cut edges are straight and clean, avoiding jagged or angled cuts that could weaken the fiber .
- o Safety precautions: Always wear eye protection and handle fiber scraps carefully, as broken fibers can cause injury .

Connectorization Considerations

Different connectors may have specific strip-length requirements for aramid yarn and buffer tubes. Always consult the strip template or chart provided by the connector manufacturer to ensure proper lengths for each layer . This ensures reliable splicing or termination and prevents signal loss or fiber damage. By following these guidelines, a 24-core optical cable can be safely prepared for splicing or connectorization while maintaining fiber integrity and performance.
