- o **Commercial or Industrial Three-Phase Box:** Can include three-phase MCBs, motor protection devices, and control circuits, significantly increasing the number of cables. These boxes are designed for higher loads and often include busbars to simplify connections .

Safety Considerations

- o Always count each conductor, device, and clamp to ensure the box is not overcrowded .
- o Follow local electrical codes for maximum wire fill and spacing. Overcrowding can lead to overheating and fire hazards.
- o Use appropriately sized boxes for the wire gauge and number of circuits to maintain safety and compliance .
