- o Fiber Core Count: Each cable may contain multiple cores; a single cable with 12 cores can occupy one port or multiple splicing positions .
- o Connector Type: Junction boxes support various connectors such as LC, SC, ST, or industrial-grade IP-LC, which can influence the number of fibers accommodated .
- o Indoor vs Outdoor Design: Outdoor boxes often include weatherproofing (IP65 rating) and may have larger enclosures to handle more fibers and cable diameters .
