

How much distance should the fiber optic cable tray support be

Under normal circumstances, the distance between the support arms of the cable tray should be about 1.5 m - 3 m, and should be verified according to specific conditions. This spacing is crucial for adequate maintenance access, ease of inspection, and ensuring proper airflow for effective heat dissipation. In addition, do not strap, tape, or attach optical fiber cables (or any other kind of cable) to the exterior of any raceway as a means of support [770. Cables installed through (or parallel to) framing members or furring strips must be protected where they are likely to be penetrated by. According to the regulations under NEC 392.8 (Other Mechanical Stresses (AJ)) in that document provides requirements for cable support. Clause 522-08-04 Where conductors or cables are not supported. Where products of five metre lengths or above are packed in bundles, they shall be supported with a minimum of three timber bearers which provide sufficient clearance to accommodate the forks of a forklift truck.

Fiber-optic cable should always be run in trays to avoid tension, crushing and bending. Tray routes should be inspected for sharp turns, snags (sometimes from other cables) and rough surfaces.

Loading spans refer to the maximum allowable distances between supports that ensure a cable tray or ladder remains stable under specified loads.
