

How to add wires to the main distribution box

Adding wires to a distribution box requires careful planning, correct wire sizing, proper breaker connections, and adherence to safety standards to ensure a reliable and safe electrical system.

Preparation and Safety

Before starting, turn off the main power supply to prevent electrical shock. Wiring Steps

- o Mount the distribution box securely at an accessible height, usually around 1.5 meters, in a dry and ventilated area.
- o Connect the incoming main power wire to the main terminal of the distribution box. Ensure the live wire is correctly identified (brown or red).
- o Install circuit breakers in the designated slots, arranging them from left to right, with reserved positions on the right if needed.
- o Connect each circuit wire to its corresponding breaker. Use parallel connections if necessary to simplify wiring.
- o Organize wiring: route wires neatly, with main circuit connections on the left and outgoing circuits on the right. Bind wires with plastic ties at uniform spacing to prevent tangling and maintain straight lines.
- o Label all circuits clearly, including AC/DC or voltage levels, to facilitate future maintenance.

Testing and Inspection

After wiring, perform a visual inspection and use a multimeter to check for continuity, correct connections, and absence of short circuits. Ensure all connections are tight and that no exposed wires are left uninsulated. Avoid overloading circuits beyond the box's rated capacity.

Schedule regular inspections to ensure long-term reliability. Consider modular designs for easier future upgrades, and always comply with local electrical codes such as NEC or IEC standards . Proper grounding and surge protection devices should be included for safety.
