

How to connect the jumper cable for the optical module

Article Overview

To connect a jumper cable to an optical module, insert the optical module into the device port, attach the fiber jumper to the module, and ensure proper alignment and protection of the connectors.

Step-by-Step Connection Procedure

1. Prepare the Tools and Materials Gather the necessary items: optical fiber jumpers, optical modules (SFP, eSFP, or GBIC), fiber cleavers, fusion splicers, and protective sleeves for connectors . 2. Insert the Optical Module

- o Insert the optical module into the designated port (e.g., SFP1 or SFP2) on the device.
 - o Ensure the module is oriented correctly: for SFP1, the label side faces upward; for SFP2, the label side faces downward .
 - o Push the module gently until it clicks into place.
3. Connect the Fiber Jumper
- o Remove the protective caps from both ends of the fiber jumper.
 - o Align the jumper connector with the optical module port. Common connector types include LC, SC, ST, and FC, depending on the module and device .
 - o Insert the connector until it clicks or is securely fastened. For LC connectors, use the latch mechanism; for SC or ST, ensure proper alignment and screw fastening if required .
 - o Avoid bending the fiber excessively; maintain a minimum bend radius of 400 mm to prevent signal loss .
4. Protect and Secure the Fiber

- o Route the fiber jumper neatly through cable management trays or slots.
 - o Coil any excess fiber and secure it with bundling tape or protective sleeves to prevent damage .
 - o Ensure the fiber is not twisted, crossed, or hanging outside the rack.
5. Test the Connection
- o Use fiber optic testing equipment to verify signal quality and stability.
 - o Confirm that the transmit and receive wavelengths of the connected optical modules match .
 - o If disconnection is needed, press the clip or latch first, then remove the fiber jumper. When removing the optical module, pull it out by the handle and wait at least 0.2 seconds before reinserting .

Additional Precautions

- o Always keep connectors clean; dust or oil can degrade signal quality .
- o Use protective sleeves when the fiber jumper is not connected.
- o Avoid using jumpers that are too short or excessively long for the installation, and do not splice two jumpers together unless necessary . Following these steps ensures a stable, high-quality optical connection and minimizes the risk of damage to the fiber or module.
