

How to fix the power distribution box wiring cables

Safety First

Inspect and Identify Issues

Correct Wiring Practices

- o Follow wiring diagrams: Refer to the distribution box wiring diagram to identify which breaker controls each circuit .
- o Wire color coding: Use standard colors--blue for neutral, yellow/green/red for phases A/B/C, and green/yellow for earth .
- o Wire gauge selection: Match wire size to circuit load. For example, 2.5mm² for lighting and sockets, 4.0mm² for high-load appliances like air conditioning .
- o Phase identification: In three-phase systems, ensure each phase (L1, L2, L3) is correctly connected to its respective breaker .

Connection and Arrangement

- o Tighten all terminals: Ensure screws on breakers, bus bars, and terminals are secure to prevent arcing .
- o Organize wiring: Route wires neatly--main circuit wiring on the left, outgoing circuits on the right. Use plastic ties to keep wires straight and evenly spaced .
- o Check protective devices: Ensure RCCB/RCD and miniature circuit breakers are properly connected to protect against overloads and short circuits .

- o Label circuits: Clearly mark AC/DC or voltage levels for each circuit .
- o Safety inspection: After wiring, inspect for potential hazards such as exposed conductors, short circuits, or overloaded circuits .
