

How to hold hair in place with a cable clip

To hold hair securely with a cable (claw) clip, gather and twist your hair, position the clip close to the scalp, and use texturizing products if needed for extra grip.

Step-by-Step Guide

1. Prepare Your Hair Start with clean, dry hair. Hair that is oily or damp can make clips slip, so wash and thoroughly dry your hair first. For fine or slippery hair, apply a texturizing spray or dry shampoo to add grip without weighing hair down . 2. Choose the Right Clip Select a cable or claw clip with strong teeth and a secure spring. For thick or long hair, use a larger clip to hold more volume. For fine hair, a smaller clip with textured teeth can prevent slippage . 3. Gather and Twist Hair Pull your hair back into a ponytail or bun. Lift the section of hair so the ends point upward, then twist it gently against your scalp. This creates tension that helps the clip hold . 4. Position the Clip Open the clip and place it where the twisted hair meets your scalp. Ensure the clip grips the base of the twist, not just the ends. For extra security, angle the clip slightly toward the scalp and consider using multiple clips for thick or heavy hair . 5. Optional Techniques for Extra Hold

- o Divide hair into two sections, tie a small ponytail with the top half, and clip both sections together for stronger hold .

- o Use bobby pins to secure loose strands or reinforce the clip.

- o Lightly mist with hairspray to maintain hold throughout the day . 6. Styling Variations

- o Full Updo: Twist all hair into a bun and secure with the clip.

- o Half-Up Style: Gather only the top half of your hair and clip it, leaving the rest down.

- o Side Sweep: Pull a section from the front and clip it to the side for a chic look . By combining proper hair preparation, the right clip, and strategic placement, your cable clip can hold hair securely all day without slipping.
