



How to install a sunshade for a distribution box

Installing a sunshade for a distribution box protects it from UV damage, reduces heat buildup, and improves visibility of control panels.

Choosing the Right Sunshade

For electrical or distribution boxes, fiberglass or FRP (Fiber Reinforced Plastic) sunshades are recommended because they are durable, UV-resistant, and weatherproof. Ensure the sunshade is sized to cover the entire box while allowing clearance for doors, vents, and wiring.

Tools and Materials Needed

- o Sunshade panel or kit suitable for your box size
- o Drill with appropriate bits
- o Screws or mounting hardware (stainless steel recommended for outdoor use)
- o Level and measuring tape
- o Anchors if mounting on masonry or non-wood surfaces
- o Safety gloves and eye protection
