

How to install wires in a factory electrical distribution box

Wiring Procedure

- o Wire Color and Specification: Use standard color codes--phase wires (A: yellow, B: green, C: red), neutral wire (blue), and protective earth (green/yellow). Select wire gauge according to load: typically 2.5mm² for lighting and sockets, 4mm² for heavy machinery or air conditioning circuits .
- o Main Supply Connection: Connect the incoming power supply to the main circuit breaker. For three-phase systems, ensure correct phase sequence. The main breaker distributes power to branch breakers.
- o Branch Circuit Wiring: Connect each branch circuit from the main breaker to its respective MCB or RCCB. Maintain neat wiring paths, with left-side wiring for incoming circuits and right-side wiring for outgoing circuits .
- o Binding and Organization: Use plastic ties to secure wires, keeping spacing uniform and wires straight. This improves safety, reduces mechanical stress, and facilitates future maintenance .
- o Protection Devices: Install MCBs, RCCBs, fuses, and surge protectors for each circuit to prevent overloads, short circuits, and electrical hazards .

Safety Checks and Testing

After wiring, perform a visual inspection to ensure no exposed conductors or loose connections. Use a

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multimeter to verify voltage, continuity, and proper grounding. Confirm that all breakers and protective devices function correctly before energizing the system . Schedule regular inspections and maintenance to ensure long-term reliability and compliance with industrial safety standards .

Labeling and Documentation

Label all circuits clearly, including load type and breaker rating. Maintain a wiring diagram and installation record for future troubleshooting, upgrades, or inspections .
