The slope of cable trays is marked using rise/run calculations or angles in design drawings and verified on-site with tools like spirit levels, plumb bobs, and laser levels.

Marking Slope in Design Drawings

When designing cable tray systems, the slope is typically applied in the vertical (Z) direction of the building plan. You can specify the slope in two main ways:

- o Rise/Run: Enter the vertical rise per horizontal run, which defines the slope ratio. For example, a 1:20 rise/run means the tray rises 1 unit for every 20 units of horizontal length.
- o Angle: Specify the slope in degrees, which is useful for precise angular measurements. You can also define the increment in degrees for consistent installation across multiple trays . These values are often set in CAD software like AutoCAD MEP under the Cable Tray Layout Preferences, ensuring that all trays added to the project follow the same slope standard .

On-Site Marking Techniques

For physical installation, marking the slope involves transferring the design slope to the actual supports and trays:

- o Spirit Level: Use a spirit level to check the slope along the support channels and ensure the tray follows the intended rise/run .
- o Plumb Bob: Helps transfer vertical reference points from the floor or ceiling to the tray supports, ensuring accurate alignment .
- o Laser Level or Crossline Combi Laser: Projects a straight line along the intended slope, allowing precise marking of support points and tray positions .
- o Permanent Marker or Spray Paint: Mark the locations of holes, threaded rods, and support channels according to the slope measurements .

Best Practices

- o Always verify the slope at multiple points along the tray run to prevent sagging or uneven cable support.
- o Ensure that the slope complies with NEC Article 392 and any local electrical codes, particularly for drainage and heat dissipation.
- o Use consistent measurement units (either degrees or rise/run) across the project to avoid errors.
- o For long runs, consider intermediate supports to maintain the slope and prevent tray deformation . By combining design specifications with careful on-site marking and verification, you can ensure that cable trays
