

# How to neatly arrange network cabinet cables

## Routing and Bundling

- o Horizontal First, Vertical Second: Run cables horizontally to the edge of the rack, bundle them, then route vertically through cable managers .
- o Group by Function: Keep similar cables together (e.g., network vs. power) and separate copper and fiber lines to reduce electromagnetic interference .
- o Maintain Bend Radius: Avoid sharp bends to prevent signal degradation, especially for Cat6A and fiber optic cables .
- o Service Loops: Leave a small slack for maintenance or future changes without creating tangles .

## Labeling and Color Coding

- o Label Both Ends: Clearly label each cable at both ends to simplify troubleshooting and maintenance .
- o Color Coding: Use colored cables, flags, or markers to quickly identify cable types or functions at a glance .

## Optimize Airflow and Safety

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- o Avoid Obstructions: Keep cables organized to allow proper airflow through the rack, reducing equipment temperature and cooling costs .
- o Prevent Hazards: Properly routed and secured cables reduce tripping risks and accidental unplugging during maintenance .

- o Pre-Made Cables: Use standard lengths (0.5m, 1m, 2m, 3m) to minimize excess slack and tangling .
- o High-Quality Cables: Invest in quality Cat6A or fiber optic cables to maintain signal integrity and simplify routing .

- o Regular Checks: Periodically review cable organization to accommodate new equipment or changes.
- o Document Changes: Update your network documentation whenever cables are added, removed, or rerouted to maintain long-term efficiency .
