

How to plug in the fiber optic interface on the router

You connect a fiber optic interface to a router by first linking the fiber cable to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) and then connecting the ONT to your router via an Ethernet cable.

Step 1: Gather Necessary Equipment

- o Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Provided by your ISP, it converts optical signals into electrical signals your router can use .
- o Fiber optic cable: Usually single-mode with SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors .
- o Router: Ensure it has a WAN port or supports fiber input via SFP/PON modules .
- o Ethernet cable: Cat6a or higher is recommended for optimal speed .

Step 2: Connect the Fiber Cable to the ONT

- o Locate the fiber wall outlet where your ISP's fiber line enters your home .
- o Remove protective caps from both the fiber cable and the ONT port.
- o Align the connector key or tab and gently insert the fiber cable until it clicks securely .
- o Power on the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize (usually 2-5 minutes), .

Step 3: Connect the ONT to Your Router

- o Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN port .
- o Power on the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm a successful connection .

Step 4: Configure and Test

- o Access your router's configuration interface via a web browser (commonly 192.168.0.1 or 192.168.1.1) to verify the internet connection .
- o Enable Quality of Service (QoS) if needed for VoIP or video streaming .
- o Check that the ONT and router are placed in a dry, ventilated area near power outlets, ideally with surge protection .

Tips for Optimal Performance

- o Handle fiber connectors carefully; dirt or scratches can degrade signal quality .
- o Keep the ONT close to the fiber entry point to minimize signal loss .
- o If your router lacks a fiber port, a media converter may be required to bridge the connection . By following these steps, your fiber optic connection will be properly established, allowing your router to deliver high-speed internet throughout your network .
