

How to sell a non-standard electrical distribution box in Canada

Non-standard electrical distribution boxes cannot be sold commercially in Canada unless they are CSA or ULC approved, but surplus or obsolete equipment can be sold to specialized buyers with proper disclosure.

Legal and Regulatory Considerations

In Canada, the Canadian Electrical Code (CEC) requires that all electrical equipment used in installations be approved by a recognized certification body, such as CSA or ULC, for the specific purpose it is intended to serve . Provincial legislation generally enforces this requirement, meaning non-CSA approved equipment cannot be legally sold or offered for sale for commercial or industrial use . Selling such equipment without certification could result in legal penalties, and insurance coverage may be voided if the equipment is used commercially .

Options for Selling Non-Standard Equipment

- o Sell as surplus or obsolete equipment: Companies like Civic Recycling in Canada purchase new, used, or obsolete electrical equipment, including hard-to-find or non-standard items. They provide estimates and offer drop-off, pickup, or shipping options, with payment via cheque or e-transfer . This is a practical route for equipment that cannot be certified for standard commercial use.
- o Field certification: If you want to sell the equipment for commercial use, it may be possible to have it field certified by a licensed inspector. Costs range from approximately CAD 75 for a basic inspection to CAD 300 for on-site certification, though full model-line certification can cost thousands . Field certification ensures the equipment meets safety standards without undergoing full CSA/ULC certification.
- o Export or sale outside Canada: Non-CSA approved equipment can be legally sold overseas, where local certification requirements differ . This avoids Canadian regulatory restrictions but requires compliance with the destination country's import rules.

Practical Sales Channels

- o Industrial buyers: Many industrial products in Canada are sold directly to end users or through short marketing channels, often concentrated in major cities like Toronto, Montreal, and Vancouver . Contacting industrial buyers or manufacturers' agents can help locate potential purchasers.
- o Wholesalers and recyclers: Surplus equipment can be sold to wholesalers, specialized recyclers, or companies that refurbish and resell electrical components .
- o Online marketplaces: Platforms for industrial equipment resale may accept non-standard items if clearly labeled as non-certified or for parts/educational purposes.
