

How to unplug the fiber optic cable from a telecom router

To safely unplug a fiber optic connector, power down the router, identify the connector type, depress or squeeze the release mechanism, and gently pull the connector straight out without twisting or bending the cable.

Step-by-Step Instructions

1. Power Down the Router Before handling the fiber optic cable, disconnect the router or optical network terminal (ONT) from its electrical source. This prevents exposure to infrared laser light and protects internal electronics from damage . 2. Clear the Workspace Ensure the area around the router is clean and free of dust or debris. Even microscopic particles can damage the delicate glass tip of the fiber connector . 3. Identify the Connector Type Common residential connectors include:

- o SC (Subscriber Connector): Square-shaped, often with a push-pull mechanism and a plastic locking tab .
 - o LC (Lucent Connector): Smaller, clip or latch mechanism, roughly half the size of SC .
 - o Other types: ST and FC connectors may also be used in some setups .
4. Release the Connector
- o For SC connectors, depress the plastic locking tab while gently pulling the connector straight out along its axis .
 - o For LC connectors, squeeze the clip or latch and pull the connector straight out without twisting .
 - o Avoid applying lateral force or bending the cable, as this can damage the internal glass fibers .
5. Handle the Cable Carefully Fiber optic cables are delicate. Do not bend, twist, or pull on the cable itself. Always apply force along the connector body to prevent internal stress or cracks .
6. Cap the Connector After removal, place protective caps on both the cable end and the router port to prevent contamination and maintain signal quality .
7. Inspect and Test If the cable is being reconnected later, inspect the connector for dirt or damage. Clean if necessary and test the connection to ensure proper signal transmission .
8. Seek Professional Help if Needed If the connector is stuck, damaged, or recessed, contact your ISP or a certified technician to avoid permanent damage . Following these steps ensures safe removal of fiber optic connectors from a telecom router while minimizing the risk of damage to the cable or device.
