- o Airflow and Thermal Management: Ensure cables do not obstruct ventilation. Modern PoE++ switches generate significant heat, so leave clear airflow paths and avoid tight bundling to prevent overheating .
- o Rack Depth and Spacing: Use racks deep enough (20"+ for PoE++ switches) and plan for 30% extra U-space to accommodate future expansion and thermal dissipation .
- o Cable Length and Bend Radius: Follow manufacturer specifications for minimum bend radius (typically 4x cable diameter for Cat6A) and use gentle bundling techniques to prevent performance degradation .
- o Labeling and Documentation: Clearly label all cables and document connections using software tools like Docusnap to facilitate troubleshooting, maintenance, and compliance with standards such as DIN EN 50173 .

Modern Considerations

- o High-Speed Cabling: Use Cat6A for 10Gbps backhaul and Wi-Fi 7 APs; Cat6 is suitable for 1Gbps or 2.5-5GbE connections .
- o Switch-to-Switch Uplinks: Prefer SFP+ DAC cables for short distances or LC-LC fiber for longer runs to reduce heat and cable bulk .
- o Avoid Zip Ties on Cat6A: They can crush the cable twists, degrading signal quality and violating TIA-568 standards .
