

## Article Overview

Pigtail installation involves preparing the wire or fiber, connecting it securely to existing lines, and attaching it to the device or network endpoint.

### Electrical Pigtail Installation

- o Cleave the Fiber: Use a high-precision cleaver to cut the fiber at a perfect 90-degree angle for optimal splicing .
- o Align and Splice: Use a fusion splicer to align the bare end of the pigtail with the main fiber cable. Perform the fusion splice to create a continuous optical path .
- o Protect the Splice: Apply a heat-shrink sleeve or protective cover to the splice to ensure durability and prevent damage .
- o Test the Connection: Use an OTDR or power meter to verify low signal loss and proper alignment. Ensure the pigtail is correctly connected to the network equipment .
