Core switches are not typically directly connected to the internet; they serve as the high-speed backbone of a network, with internet access routed through firewalls and edge devices for security.

Role of Core Switches

Core switches operate at the backbone of a hierarchical network, aggregating traffic from distribution switches and providing ultra-low latency and high throughput across the enterprise network . They are optimized for speed, scalability, and redundancy, and are central to maintaining network stability and performance . Unlike access switches, which connect directly to end-user devices, core switches focus on routing and switching large volumes of internal traffic efficiently .

Internet Connectivity Considerations

Directly connecting a core switch to the internet is generally not recommended due to security risks. Core switches are designed for internal traffic aggregation, not for exposure to external threats. Instead, internet access should be routed through border routers and firewalls that provide protection against attacks such as unauthorized access, VLAN hopping, and DDoS attacks . If a connection to the internet is required for redundancy or management purposes, it should be implemented using:

- o Dedicated VLANs for external-facing devices, isolated from internal traffic.
- o Access ports for routers and firewalls, avoiding direct exposure of the core switch to the internet.
- o Security hardening measures such as disabling DTP, CDP, and unnecessary spanning-tree features on ports connected to external devices .

Best Practices

- o Use firewalls and edge routers to mediate all internet traffic, keeping the core switch internal.
- o Implement redundant connections with HSRP or VRRP for high availability without exposing the core switch directly .
- o Segregate management traffic from user and internet traffic using separate VLANs.
- o Monitor and audit core switch traffic to detect anomalies and prevent potential attacks.
- o Avoid running resource-heavy services like deep packet inspection on core switches to maintain low latency and high throughput .
